

The Department of Biology in the College of Science and Mathematics invites applications and nominations for a visiting instructor position (#12063), with primary teaching responsibilities to include Introductory Biology and Anatomy and Physiology on the **Armstrong and Liberty** campuses.

At Georgia Southern, visiting instructors normally teach fifteen credit hours per semester, hold regular office hours, and participate in departmental meetings and activities. Collegiality is essential. All visiting positions are non-tenure track, academic-year (9/10 month) appointments. Appointments are for one year only, although there is the possibility of reappointment contingent upon funding and satisfactory performance. The second year would be a terminal year, without exception.

We are seeking applications from candidates who can demonstrate experience in teaching individuals from diverse backgrounds and contribute to the University's mission, vision, and core values.

Required Qualifications:

- An earned master's or doctoral degree in Biology or a closely related field with at least 18 graduate semester hours in Biology or Physiology courses by August 1, 2020.
- Commitment to teaching that is consistent with the College's priorities for the Department and the mission of the University.
- Willingness to engage with institutional student success initiatives.
- Commitment to engaging with best practice initiatives in instruction and pedagogy, mentoring, and curriculum design and development.
- Commitment to work in a diverse academic and professional community and to implement diversity initiatives in the classroom as delineated by the University, college, and department.
- Ability to teach Introductory Biology sequence (BIOL 1107 and 1108), Human Anatomy and Physiology sequence (2081 and 2082) and associated lab classes.
- Must be able to work on both Armstrong and Liberty campuses.
- Must be authorized to work in the United States for the duration of employment without assistance from the institution.

Preferred Qualifications:

- A minimum of one year of college/university teaching experience in biology, physiology, or related field.
- Experience with the development and delivery of academic courses in both traditional and online formats.
- Previous experience teaching one or more of the courses listed within Required Qualifications.

We will begin screening applications as they are received. The position starts on August 1, 2020 (classes begin on August 17<sup>th</sup>). A complete application consists of a letter addressing the qualifications cited above, including a verifiable statement regarding authorization to work, unassisted, in the US; a curriculum vitae; names, contact information, and email addresses of at least three professional references.
